### PARENTMAIL

**A note to our new parents:** ParentMail integrates with our data management system in school, therefore, the mobile phone number and email address we hold for each parent on our system will automatically synchronise with ParentMail. To begin receiving emails and texts, parents will need to 'connect' with ParentMail. Please look out for your activation email which can sometimes hide in your junk folder.

**A note to all parents:** To access ParentMail facilities, please download their app. Simply search 'ParentMail' in the Apple or Android App store. The app enables parents to:

- Pay for school dinners and trips
- Book parents' evening appointments
- Give permission for your child to participate in school events

The ParentMail system automatically sends an email to parents when the balance of their child's school dinner account is less than £6. If your child only has a packed lunch, please disregard these emails.

## OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Our School has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and South Yorkshire Police. This project is known as Operation Encompass.

Operation Encompass is the notification to schools that a child (under 18) has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident. This will ordinarily be done by the start of the next school day. Operation Encompass will ensure that a specifically trained member of the school

staff, known as a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), is informed.

The DSL can then use the information, in confidence, to ensure the wellbeing of the child. The school may be able to make provisions or adjustments to assist the young person and their family. Our school is keen to offer the best support possible to all of our young people and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

## PUPIL DIARIES

Children will be very proud to bring their new school diaries home this week. We hope that these diaries will support children in becoming more independent learners by ensuring they are more aware of, and therefore more prepared and organised for, events that are upcoming.

In addition to using the diary for events, diaries are to be used for the following:

- **A record of reading.** We hope that you as parents will find them of use for recording daily reading at home. For every entry, pupils will receive a footprint stamp in order to reach the six destinations in their reading passport! Your child's passport will track their journey around the world over the next four years - please encourage them to keep it extra safe in the special plastic wallet towards the back of their diary. Reading group sessions in class will be recorded and also, on the yellow pages, children will record their termly star reading test results plus keep a log of the books they have read alongside quiz scores.
- **A record of rewards.** Your child will use their diary to record their daily behaviour score, tally the tokens they have earned each week and, on the blue pages, collect merits and Headteacher's awards awarded for academic achievements.
- **Home-School Agreement.** This week, your child's class will spend time looking at our home-school agreement that can be found on pages 2 and 3 of the diary. We request that you take a moment to discuss and sign the 'home' section with your child.
- **Home/School Communication.** Please feel free to use the diary to jot a message to your child's teacher. (Please ensure your child draws their teacher's attention to the message.)

Please encourage your child to use their diary regularly, to look after it and to bring it to school each day. We have a small number of diaries for the arrival of any new pupils. If your child loses their diary, they may be able to purchase a replacement diary for £4. We look forward to your support in helping us make them a success.
